Types of questions

Types of questions	Examples for Food Security
Purposes questions <i>Determine purpose or intention</i>	What is the purpose of this news article? What is the aim of the Singapore Food Agency? What is the agenda of this group of people?
Concepts questions <i>Define issues and concepts</i>	What is food security? How does Singapore secure food supply? What examples or countries has food security?
Assumption questions <i>Examine presuppositions</i>	How do we know Singapore’s food supply is secured? Why do we think food security is a challenge? Isn’t Singapore’s food supply secured?
Evidence questions <i>Dig deeper to find proof</i>	Which statistics show an increase in demand for food? What evidence supports the need to diversify food supplies? What proves that food security is a challenge?
Implication questions <i>Examine the impacts</i>	What would happen if Singapore obtains eggs only from Malaysia? What are the impacts of a vegetarian diet? Would investing in agro-technology help secure food supply?
Viewpoint questions <i>Challenge a specific perspective to uncover other aspects</i>	Why do think food security should be the government’s priority? Why should I change my dietary habits? Why should I care what I eat when food is secured?

<p>Questions about questions <i>Reflects on the questions asked</i></p>	<p>Why is this question important to me? Is this question easy or difficult to answer? Where would this question lead to?</p>
