5. SUMMARY OF FIVE (5)-YEAR BUSINESS DEVELOPMENT PLAN

The following is a summary of the Five (5)-Year Business Development Plan of the Digistar Group:

5.1 EXPANSION INTO THE EDUCATION SECTOR

In line with realising the Malaysian Government's Smart School initiatives as outlined under the 8th Malaysia Plan, the Group plans to expand its market further into the local education sector by introducing and implementing the Interactive Media Management System and electronic communication system in the local learning and teaching institutions and smart school multimedia teaching environment, with a full range of audio and visual systems, video projection systems, integrated control systems and media retrieval systems.

5.2 EXPANSION INTO THE HEALTHCARE SECTOR, CAPITALISING ON TELEMEDICINE AND COMMUNICATION SYSTEM

As outlined under the 8MP, primary healthcare will remain the focus of national health development while concerted efforts will be continued to improve equity and quality in the provision of health services for the population. This will include further development and expansion of the scope of primary, secondary and tertiary healthcare, greater use of ICT in the delivery of health services as well as more emphasis on increasing the quantity, capacity, capability and quality of health personnel to meet the demand of the rapidly expanding health sector. As such, the use of information, telecommunication and multimedia technologies in providing healthcare, better known as Telemedicine, will provide the potential for the Group to tap into.

The Group also intends to ride on the potential growth by providing system integration for specialised technology work for the healthcare sector such as hospital communication system, LAN and integrated audio and visual system.

5.3 DIVERSIFYING INTO PROVISION OF MAINTENANCE SERVICES

With the global trend pointing towards outsourcing practice as part of the organisation's cost control measures besides meeting business needs faster and smarter, the Group has identified the provision of maintenance services as one of its five (5)-year business plans.

As the provision of maintenance service in-house involves both technical skills capabilities and heavy overhead cost, organisations can no longer do everything they need to do internally. Management in most organisations are pressured to improve performance financially and to look at ways to improve its cost structure. Organisations make their decisions for technology and technical-based outsourcing based on technical skills, vendor experience, services features, timely delivery, reputation and price.

The Group, with over twenty (20) years of experience, and having had more than four hundred (400) specialist projects on record with a RM49 million in its order book as of 22 September 2003, believes such a business model will be highly profitable and will offer tremendous market opportunities to tap into. As part of its core business, the Group can offer its clients the relevant resources and technical know-how in the provision of outsourcing maintenance services for the ICT sector.

5.4 NEW PRODUCT DEVELOPMENT

5.4.1 Forming alliances in R&D

In order to stay competitive, in terms of pricing, products as well as services, greater cooperation between manufacturers and suppliers has become more necessary than ever. The Group had in January 2003 formed strategic alliances with its overseas principal and an individual to undertake R&D in the interactive media management system for local teaching and learning institutions via DRMSB. DRMSB successfully obtained the MSC status from Multimedia Development Corporation Sdn Bhd in July 2003.

5.4.2 Software development for Smart-Home applications

The Group plans to move up the value chain by venturing into the software development for the smart - home application whereby it is able to integrate all home components and appliances into a single remote control, and customising to the needs of the customers in order to meet constantly evolving trends in the ICT infrastructure industry.

5.5 MOVING DOWNSTREAM INTO THE RETAIL SEGMENT VIA SMART PARTNERSHIP ARRANGEMENT

The Group intends to enter into "smart partnership" arrangements with identified entrepreneurs or small-medium sized enterprises for products suitable for the retailing market. Such agreements would provide mutual benefits for both the Group and the selected entrepreneurs or enterprises as it provides a diversification of business at economics of scale and enables the Group to tap the wider market whilst creating business opportunities for entrepreneurs or enterprises.

5.6 HUMAN RESOURCE POLICY

In line with the Company's expansion plan, the Company will continue to employ additional staff to support the level of business and operations. The Company conducts in-house training for its technical staff and keeps them informed of the latest technology in the market through external courses and seminars. In recognition of the employees' contribution to the Company's success, the ESOS will be implemented in conjunction with the Company's listing on the MESDAQ Market.

Overall, it is the Group's strong commitment to innovation, developing its people, improving the Group's productivity and efficiency that will enable it to face the challenges ahead.

The restriction is specifically endorsed on the notices of allotment representing the respective shareholdings of the substantial shareholders/promoters which are under moratorium to ensure that trading of these shares is not allowed in compliance with the restriction imposed by the KLSE/SC. The restriction is fully accepted by the substantial shareholders/promoters and the public is deemed to have notice of this restriction.

The entire shareholding of KLSB amounting to 48,809,397 Digistar Shares, representing 58.5% of the enlarged issued and paid-up share capital of Digistar, are under moratorium as proposed by Digistar and approved by the KLSE/SC.
